Municipal Police Academy (919-hours)

We have also created a stand-alone information document called the **HACC – Police Academy Communication (PAC)**. The PAC will be updated periodically and posted, at the bottom of the webpage—referred to above. It will contain specific information for the upcoming Academy session/s; including how to apply and various testing dates.

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MIST – Mandatory In-Service Training

All officers are required to complete 12 hours of in-service training to maintain their Act 120 certification. Beginning January 2025, ALL 4 of the MPOETC courses will be provided by HACC, AT NO COST to certified municipal officers and/or county detectives (those whose records are maintained in TACS by MPOETC).

Departments will still register their officers for the MIST training as always, but there will be no charge and therefore, no billing for any of the four MPOETC in-service courses.

In 2025, Legal Updates and Law Enforcement Response to Homeless Persons are **mandatory** courses and must be taken by every certified municipal officer. Tactical Response and Elder Abuse and Exploitation are the other two elective courses that can be taken to satisfy the yearly MIST requirement. Also, MPOETC-approved CLEE courses can be taken in place of the two elective courses.

Departments who are not maintained in TACS, but who are permitted to take the MPOETC courses will have to pay \$25.00 per officer for any of the four (4) courses for 2025. A Permission to Bill form must be completed for these officers.

<u>Please Note:</u> The Mandatory In-Service Training (MIST) requirement consists of four courses for 2025.

Legal Update 25-001 (3 hrs. MPOETC credit/mandatory) \$25

A three-hour course that will review recent statutory changes to the Pennsylvania Crimes Code, Vehicle Code, and Rules of Criminal Procedures that were communicated via TACS throughout the calendar year to officers. The course will also highlight pertinent court decisions and significant pieces of legislation that affect police operations and investigations from Pennsylvania's Commonwealth, Superior and Supreme Courts, various Federal Courts, and the U.S. Supreme Court.

Law Enforcement Response to Homeless Persons 25-002 (3 hrs. MPOETC credit/Mandatory) \$25

A three-hour course exploring the issue of homelessness and law enforcement's response. The course will examine the prevalence of the issue, the varying degrees of homelessness and factors that lead to homelessness, to include a discussion of homeless persons as offenders and victims. Finally, the course will address procedural justice practices that are designed to address issues such as implicit bias.

<u>Tactical Response 25-003</u> (<u>3 hrs. MPOETC credit/elective</u>) \$25

A three-hour course designed to encourage officers to prepare mentally and physically to respond to an active threat. This course will establish guidelines and best practices, beginning with response to the call and concluding with tactical considerations. This course will also explore ways in which law enforcement can be better equipped to handle an active threat incident.

Elder Abuse and Exploitation 25-004 (3 hrs. MPOETC credit/elective) \$25

A three-hour course that will help officers recognize the signs of elder abuse and exploitation, including physical abuse, psychological abuse, sexual abuse, and neglect, with an emphasis on financial exploitation. This course will provide guidelines within the criminal justice system to assist officers in prosecution using local, state, and Federal resources to increase successful outcomes for the victims.

PFTP – PLEC Firearms Training Program

The PFTP (Piccola Law Enforcement Complex Firearms Training Program) provides Lethal Weapons Act 235 agents, security personnel, law enforcement, persons interested in self-protection, firearm marksmen, and enthusiasts with a wide selection of training.

Our courses can train the beginner and assist the experienced firearm owner—and any level in between. The PFTP firearm instructors have extensive law enforcement, military and/or competitive marksmanship experience—which allows us to provide very dynamic, insightful training. We have also consulted practicing Pennsylvania assistant district attorneys on some of our courses; such as the Basic PA Law for Handgun Ownership, Use, and Liability.

Our range classes are held on our state-of-the-art indoor range. Some of our classes will be held in a real-world environment; such as our Active Shooter Response – Best Practices, where the student will train in one of our actual campus buildings.

We believe in professional training, by professionals, to assist our students in becoming responsible, well-informed firearm users. *The ultimate responsibility of carrying/using a firearm will always rest with the individual.*

Basic Pennsylvania Law for Handgun Ownership, Use, and Liability (2-hr Online) - \$30

This 2-hour online course is highly recommended for any civilian who intends on possessing a handgun for self-protection.

This course will provide the civilian handgun owner with basic knowledge regarding the laws of Pennsylvania as it pertains to handgun ownership, use and liability. This course is appropriate for yearly attendance—as the course material will be reviewed and updated annually (in November), with updates released in January of the new year.

Basic Handgun Marksmanship and Safety for Civilian (2-hr Online) - \$30

This 2-hour online course is designed for the civilian who is brand new to handgun ownership or a novice. It provides basic knowledge about handguns.

Students will be provided with instruction about the nomenclature of the pistol and handgun, firearms safety, and storage. Course content will also show the proper loading and unloading of firearms, along with the fundamentals of marksmanship. After completing this course, it is recommended that the student schedule the Basic Handgun Marksmanship and Safety for Civilian (In-person Range) course immediately to get the most out of each "basic" course.

LETHAL WEAPONS TRAINING (Act 235) – General Information

The PLEC of HACC, Central Pennsylvania's Community College, is a certified center as specified by the Pennsylvania Lethal Weapons Training Act 235. Each participant who receives an approval letter from the Pennsylvania State Police (PSP) to attend this course and successfully completes the program will be certified by the PSP, Lethal Weapons Certification section. This training is designed for an individual, 18 years or older, who is employed for the purpose of providing security, protective patrol, detective or criminal investigative services for a fee and who carries a firearm, baton, or other lethal weapon in the course of his/her employment. In order to be certified, the applicant must pass a physical, psychological examination, and a criminal history check. Appropriate PSP application forms must be completed by the applicant.

HOW TO REGISTER – Before you can register, you must do the following:

- Receive an approval letter from the PSP for this training
- You must send the letter to our office via email <u>policetrng@hacc.edu</u>
- You will then be contacted by our office with registration instructions!

The certification is not one of attendance but of successful completion. Please be advised that all forms are available through the Lethal Weapons website at <u>www.psp.pa.gov/lethalweapons</u>.

NOTE: If enrollment numbers are insufficient or an emergency situation should occur, courses may be canceled with limited notice.

Lethal Weapons Act 235 Certification (40 hrs.) \$390

Act 235 is a certification class. <u>Students taking this class should already be proficient in</u> <u>using a firearm</u>—as this <u>**IS NOT**</u> a beginner's course for new shooters.

The purpose of this course is to develop knowledge of the critical nature of the use of force as applied to Certified agents. Justification of use of force in the protection of life and property will be included. The student will learn safe handling of firearms and fire a familiarization course with a 12-gauge shotgun and meet qualification standards with a handgun.

This course consists of 26 hours for the Academic Training module, which includes 4 hours for the Skills Training module and then 14 hours for the Firearms Training module. Participants must successfully pass a written examination and a firearms qualification.

Students must have the ability to safely participate in the firearms course required for Lethal Weapons, Act 235 certification. One of the timed stages of this course requires kneeling and rising unassisted.

<u>Required equipment for this course</u>: A handgun that is at least a .38 or 9mm caliber and less than .50 caliber—which must be in good, operable condition as determined by HACC Range Instructors; at least two (2) magazines for semi-automatic pistols or at least one (1) speed loader for revolvers; 250 rounds of FACTORY ammunition (5 boxes of 50) for your weapon (NO RELOADS!); a "strong-side" hip holster; a cleaning kit and rags; eye and ear protection, and a baseball-style hat.

HACC will provide the use of a shotgun and ammunition during the shotgun familiarization portion of the course.

NOTE: An accidental discharge or an unsafe range incident as determined by our instructor/s; which results in the student being dismissed from the range is considered a failure of the firearms portion.

NOTE: Do not bring firearms to the classroom portions of this course.

Lethal Weapons Act 235 Certification – Academic-Only \$205

Individuals who are interested in certification <u>without firearms</u> are required to attend a 26-hour course, which includes 22 hours of classroom instruction and 4 hours of armed and unarmed defense. Participants must successfully pass a written examination.

The Academic-Only Certification will be scheduled during a "regular" 40-hour Lethal Weapons class.

Lethal Weapons Act 235 Certification – Firearms Upgrade or repeat \$190

Individuals who have been Act 235 certified without firearms can make a request to PSP to upgrade their certification to "with firearms". Upon receiving an upgrade approval letter to "with firearms" they can take the firearms upgrade.

The upgrade or repeat of the firearms portion of the 40-hour class, after failure, will be scheduled during a "regular" 40-hour Lethal Weapons class.

Lethal Weapons Act 235 Recertification (8 hrs.) \$200

Individuals are required to successfully complete the recertification course every 5 years.

The purpose of this course is to provide an update and refresher on those sections of the PA Crimes Code that are most applicable to certified agents. The student will learn how a pistol, revolver, and shotgun operate and safe handling techniques. The student will be required to demonstrate proficiency in the use of a handgun and the safe handling and firing of a 12-gauge shotgun.

This course consists of 4-hours of classroom instruction and 4-hours of firearms training. Participants must successfully pass a written examination and a firearms qualification.

<u>Required equipment for this course</u>: A handgun that is at least a .38 or 9mm caliber and less than .50 caliber—which must be in good, operable condition as determined by HACC Range Instructors; at least two (2) magazines for semi-automatic pistols or at least one (1) speed loader for revolvers; 150 rounds of FACTORY ammunition (3 boxes of 50) for your weapon (NO RELOADS!); a "strong-side" hip holster; a cleaning kit and rags; eye and ear protection, and a baseball-style hat.

HACC will provide the use of a shotgun and ammunition during the shotgun familiarization portion of the course.

NOTE: An accidental discharge or an unsafe range incident as determined by our instructor/s; which results in the student being dismissed from the range is considered a failure of the firearms portion.

NOTE: Do not bring firearms to the classroom portions of this course.

Lethal Weapons Act 235 Recertification – Academic-Only \$110

This course consists of 4-hours of classroom instruction. Participants must successfully pass a written examination.

The Academic-Only Recertification will be scheduled during a "regular" 8-hour Lethal Weapons Recertification class.

Section numbers are created as needed.

Lethal Weapons Act 235 - Class failure of either part of the 8-hr recertification class \$110

To repeat either the academic or firearms portion of the 8-hour class.

Participants must successfully pass a written examination on the classroom portion or a firearms qualification on the range—whichever is applicable.

The "repeat" of either the academic or firearms portion will be scheduled during a "regular" 8-hour Lethal Weapons Recertification class.

NOTE: An accidental discharge or an unsafe range incident as determined by our instructor/s; which results in the student being dismissed from the range is considered a failure of the firearms portion.

Note: You must repeat the course at the same location.

Section numbers are created as needed.

Firearms Qualification - Retired Law Enforcement Officers \$85

This 4-hour program is designed to authorize retired law enforcement officers to carry concealed weapons from state to state in accordance with Act 79, the Retired Law Enforcement Identification Act (RLEIA).

Admission to the course will not be permitted unless applicants report on the scheduled training date with the following required documents:

- Retired Officer Concealed Carry Acknowledgement Form—which can be printed from the MPOETC website <u>www.mpoetc.state.pa.us</u>
- Two forms of identification (your retired officer identification card and photo identification such as a driver's license)

<u>Required equipment for this course</u>: A handgun that is at least a .38, .380 or 9mm in caliber and less than .50 caliber—which must be in good, operable condition as determined by HACC Range Instructors; at least two (2) magazines for semi-automatic pistols or at least one (1) speed loader for revolvers; 150 rounds of FACTORY ammunition for your handgun (NO RELOADS!); a holster; eye and ear protection, and a baseball-style hat.

Active Shooter Response – Best Practices (for certified Lethal Weapons Act 235 agents AND LE officers) \$190 – per agent \$170 per agent – Agency Pricing at 5 or more

This 8-hour class (4-hrs classroom/4-hrs practical) is highly interactive and designed to train armed security personnel (active, certified Lethal Weapons—Act 235 agents) who may find themselves responding to an active shooter event in the course of their employment; and active law enforcement officers.

<u>Attention Agencies</u> – we believe the best way for teams to perform optimally, is to train together! Thus, we are pleased to offer agency pricing (see above) for your personnel if you bring 5 or more of your agents to train with us!

Topics include: the history of active shooters, best practices for response, recognizing signs of potential violence, the four types of threats, threat assessment, types of attacks, first responders (police) tactics for active shooters, tactical room entry, navigating stairs and other movements—plus much more.

During the practical portion of this course, students will train inside one of our campus buildings, which will allow for a very realistic experience. They will learn how to properly navigate stairwells, hallways, bathrooms, and rooms; in a tactical manner. Students will be utilizing our Cool Fire© Trainer system, which will allow them to engage targets that are placed in the training environment.

Students are NOT required to bring any equipment to this training. They will be equipped with our CoolFire© Trainer system and a duty belt with a holster.

NOTE: You will be REQUIRED to submit a copy of your valid Lethal Weapons—Act 235 Certification Card to our office before you are allowed to schedule with us OR your official law enforcement.

Custom Qualification for Firearms \$210 – per student \$190 per student – Agency Pricing at 5 or more

Not sure if this 4-hour course is for your organization If your church has an armed security team, if your organization provides security for display shows, if your organization provides security for parking at events, **if your organization works mainly at night (<u>night fire instruction available</u>)**—or if your organization does anything similar; you should take a look at this course. It will provide your organization with an extra level of professionalism, as it establishes a level of weapon proficiency that you can easily display.

This 4-hour course was specifically designed for any organization who wants to develop a "custom qualification course" for their particular needs. Firearm Competency Evaluation \$235 – per student \$225 per student – Agency Pricing at 5 or more

This 4-hour course will allow an organization to assess the competency of persons that will carry a firearm while they perform their duties. Organizations who require, or who will require, personnel to carry a firearm must be trained responsibly and properly, and this course is the "First Step."

The course is designed in a manner where the student and organization will receive a written report (Firearm Competency Evaluation) on the competency/skill of the student regarding safe firearm handling skills and marksmanship. The report will also contain recommendations on future training needed, to accomplish the stated goal of the organization, for the student.

Please Note: Courses with a CLEE number listed **MAY BE APPROVED** by the Municipal Police Officers' Education and Training Commission (MPOETC) for credit toward an officer's continuing law enforcement education requirement. Please maintain a copy of your certificate from these courses to offer as proof of attendance at the end of the certification period. Some courses are not yet CLEE approved; please check the MPOETC website for courses approved after this calendar was released. Departments will have the responsibility to report this information to MPOETC at the end of the certification period, not HACC.

Pennsylvania Act 120 Prep Course I (Laws and Criminal Procedure) (Online) \$50

The Commonwealth of Pennsylvania Municipal Police Officers' Education and Training Commission (MPOETC) requires anyone eligible to be certified as a police officer in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, take and pass a 200-question multiple choice question exam after a cadet completes a Basic Recruit Curriculum for Municipal Police Officers.

This course is designed as a prep course covering one section of the exam (Laws and Criminal Procedure). 59 of the 200 questions come from this section. This course will cover three areas that make up Laws and Criminal Procedure: Criminal Law, Criminal Procedure, and Search & Seizure.

This is a condensed review. In addition to the review, we have added numerous sample questions to help you "brush-up" on the topics in preparation for the MPOETC exam. As a caveat, HACC does not know what questions are asked on the MPOETC exam. We use the learning objectives provided by MPOETC to teach this review. Harrisburg Area Community College is a Certified Police Training Academy. Our Academy and staff have been successful in preparing police cadets to take this exam for many years.

Others that could benefit from this course: Law Enforcement Officer Refresher, Law students, Law Enforcement promotional testing, or Criminal Justice Students.

Crime Scene Technology Series – Forensic Classes

This series of modules is designed for the student who desires to become a certified crime scene technician. The series is designed for the student to take all modules in the sequence offered. Class sizes are limited; therefore, students should prepare to enroll in all modules. Preference for future registrations will be given to those who have successfully completed the Crime Scene Management module. Only when all modules are successfully completed or an authorized waiver** is given, plus a successful score achieved on the final exam, will the student be awarded the Certificate of Completion.

(A Sen. Jeffrey E. Piccola Law Enforcement Complex administrator must approve the applicant's completed course outline with an attached photocopy of the training certificate. This application process should be completed prior to the module being offered.)

Crime Scene Management and Documentation (2 Days) (CLE00015) \$210

Students will learn to properly manage and document a crime scene; including proper assessment, control, search techniques, walkthrough techniques, crime scene sketching, evidence documentation, chain of custody, and the legal requirements of evidence. This course includes hands-on exercises that will involve physical evidence recognition, collection, and documentation.

Officers will be informed about methods of lifting latent prints; such as powders, Ninhydrin, Iodine, and Silver Nitrate. Also, Cyanoacrylate and various dyes will be discussed. Approximately 50% of the time will be allocated to experiments with officers conducting challenging latent print recoveries.
